Sending ASIS Chapter Emails

In the position of Communications Coordinator, I am often requested to disseminate group emails to the ASIS member chapter list. Many of these requests are of interest to the members and contain suitable and acceptable information based on the Board's acceptable use policy. Occasionally a request will be sent to me that is open to discussion with the Board as it may be for unsolicited contacts, recruitment, advertising or for-profit enterprises.

I am taking this opportunity to clarify the purpose of the group email system to ensure that everyone is familiar with the usage and procedure. I also want to reiterate that all information shared about people and organizations is confidential and that the membership list will not be provided to any third party for any reason. In addition, the "Bcc" mode is used to send out all messages to ensure email addresses and membership lists are kept confidential.

Acceptable uses of the email list include internal exchanges of information about security issues such as crime trends, job postings, publicizing security events and upcoming meetings. Training and security educational programs that are offered with recognized designations by recognized institutions would be supported by ASIS. Private and for-profit companies that wish to advertise courses, products and services are encouraged to attend the monthly networking luncheons to promote these events. Thank you.



CPP Representative Report:

The chapter got off to a good start in 2006 with implementing a CPP study schedule starting March 21. Following the Edmonton chapter's lead, we learned from a chapter which has had many years of successful study groups. The 2006 group has 22 students. Starting in late March, the group will get together for weekly study sessions until June 24 when the group will write their second of 2 practice exams. The group will be focusing their study time on all 4 of the Protection of Assets Manuals, the Handbook of Crime Prevention and Loss Prevention, 4th Edition and A Security Professional's Practical Guide to the Law, written by the chapter's own Dave Ray.

All students will be expected to put between 12-15 hours a week in addition to the 3 hours study group. For the first week, we will be meeting on a Tuesday evening but after this, the group will meet every Wednesday from 6-9 pm at Fifth Avenue Place. The chapter has an outstanding list of presenter/facilitators lined up who will work with the members to answer and discuss any questions that will come up.

Students will then schedule their CPP exams when they feel comfortable in writing it. The cost per member is \$50.00. The goal in 2007 will be to start early January and run till mid to late April.

In 2002, he received his Certified Information Systems Security Professional (CISSP) designation.
